BIRCH

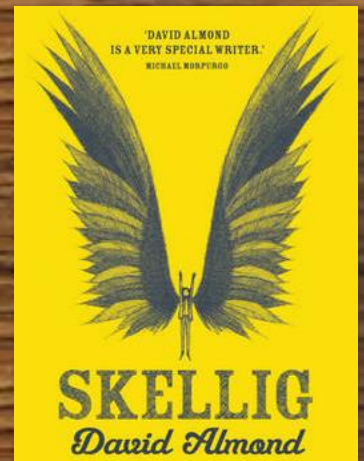
This term, Birch class are reading the exciting adventure book *Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx* by Joe Todd-Stanton!
